3. Description of the training offered:

JumpStart is a 14-week construction-training program for Baltimore City residents with a high school diploma or GED[®]. Experienced teachers help students understand job readiness and prepare for success on the construction site. Students also receive essential safety training, financial coaching, a stipend and driver's education. More than 80% of graduates are placed in construction jobs, with many leading to solid careers in the construction industry.

4. Trainees have the opportunity to earn the following industry-recognized certifications:

- CPR
- First Aid
- OSHA 10

5. Am I eligible?

Must be:

- 18 and older
- A Baltimore City resident
- Have a high school diploma or GED[®]

6. What is the application process?

All interested residents first complete an intake application that includes a 17 question math assessment. The intake helps staff determine who should move the interview phase. If selected for an

interview all applicants must attend the interview on-time and pass a drug-screen urinalysis to be considered for enrollment.

7. How much can I expect to earn if I complete this program and obtain employment in the construction field?

The average annual pay for a beginner Construction Worker in Maryland is \$37,895.
