# Maryland Hospitality Management Apprenticeship Program



## OVERVIEW

In June 2023, the Maryland Department of Labor (MD Labor) received a State Apprenticeship Expansion Formula grant award from the U.S. Department of Labor Employment and Training Administration. Part of MD Labor's project concept includes \$1,637,769 to create and implement the brand new **Maryland Hospitality Management Apprenticeship Program**. This exciting initiative will create a career pathway that includes an associate degree and management-level positions for those employed in the hospitality sector. The project period is July 1, 2023-June 30, 2026.

## WHO IS PARTICIPATING?

The **Maryland Hospitality Management Apprenticeship Program** was developed in partnership with the Maryland Association of Community Colleges and the State's 16 community colleges. Specifically, six colleges will act as the Sponsor and develop Hospitality Management Registered Apprenticeships:

1. Allegany College of Maryland;
2. Baltimore City Community College;
3. Carroll Community College;
4. Frederick Community College;
5. Howard Community College; and
6. Prince George's Community College.
