

## **MOSH Training and Education**

The MOSH Training and Education office offers free publications, videos, seminars and speakers at locations across the State to provide Maryland employers and employees with information about MOSH safety and health requirements.

**PUBLICATIONS and VIDEOS** are maintained and available free of charge to employers and employees.

**SEMINARS** - Maryland Occupational Safety and Health (MOSH) and the Maryland Center for Environmental Training (MCET) are partnering to present a training outreach program to address risks to worker health and safety. There is no cost to participate in any of these training seminars and college Continuing Education Units (CEUs) will be available to participants. Presented in partnership with cosponsoring community colleges throughout the State, each seminar provides current information on regulations and techniques for prevention of work-related illnesses and injuries. These comprehensive half-day and full-day seminars are offered at four locations throughout Maryland: Central Maryland (Laurel), Eastern Shore, Southern Maryland, and Western Maryland. Seminars are presented by MOSH staff and other health and safety practitioners.

**SPEAKERS** are provided for professional and trade associations, employer and employee organizations, and other groups. These programs must be requested in writing and are provided on an "as available" basis. Requests should be made as far in advance as possible to determine whether MOSH can provide the type of presentation requested and to ensure that the proposed date is mutually agreeable.

Note: Speakers are provided for a minimum of 20 participants, and generally are not available to individual employers. The presentations provide an overview of a specific topic and are not a substitute for the training an employer must provide to meet the requirements of MOSH standards.

## **MOSH Training and Education does NOT provide training:**

- To meet the formal training requirements of MOSH safety and health standards. It is the responsibility of each employer to provide the required training.
- To comply with the training time requirements of specific MOSH standards, such as the requirements of 29 CFR 1910.120 Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response
- On specific work processes or equipment operation such as scaffold erection
- As part of an informal conference or for abatement of a citation issued to an employer
- To employees of fee-charging consultants or as part of a service that a private consultant offers to an employer
