Dear Maryland Employer,

It's survey time!

Every year this time, you get an opportunity to contribute to Maryland's prevailing wage rates for the following year.

Employers are encouraged to take this opportunity to submit payroll information for work performed in up to 144 different job classifications between **November 1, 2021 through October 31, 2022** for consideration in preparing the wage determinations for 2023.

Survey data is accepted from all 23 countries and Baltimore City - -all work, in all localities. The survey closes at midnight on October 31.

ATTENTION MECHANICAL SERVICE PROVIDERS: New this year, and in accordance with SB259, starting October 1, 2022, mechanical service contracts are now a part of the prevailing wage and Maryland employers can submit related wage rates. Read more here: <u>SB259 Service Contracts</u>

In addition to Building, Highway, Dredging and Mechanical Systems Service, below is a list of job classifications that you can submit payroll information for inclusion in the prevailing wage rate survey. Remember, there are 144 different job classifications.
